FOOD SOVEREIGNTY PROGRAM

We strengthen the food autonomy of families through the raising and consumption of guinea pigs (Cavia porcellus) as a strategy that provides a comprehensive solution to the hunting of other endangered species such as the tapir while at the same time we restore fragile ecosystems with the support of this ancestral livestock farming



PRODUCTIVE NUCLEI

The goal is to facilitate the establishment of ecological meat production nuclei with the help of families, creating the first cooperative of guinea pig farmers in each region and establishing sales points for marketing in renowned restaurants



REGENERATIVE AGRICULTURE SCHOOLS

This initiative is dedicated to promoting education on regenerative agriculture through the raising of guinea pigs (Cavia porcellus) in rural schools, with the goal of integrating practical and theoretical knowledge about guinea pig farming into the school curriculum

SUSTAINABLE AND ASSOCIATIVE MODEL

Step 1: Initial Family Support

Target Family Selection: Identify a family interested in guinea pig farming, preferably with a background in agriculture or animal husbandry.

Nuclei Distribution: Provide the selected family with a guinea pig nuclei consisting of one male and nine females.

Step 2: Training and Resources

Training Programs: Organize workshops to educate the family on proper guinea pig care, breeding techniques, and sustainable farming practices.

Resource Provision: Supply necessary resources such as feed, housing materials, and health care supplies for the initial setup.

Step 3: Community Integration

Establishing a Cooperative: Encourage the supported family to form or join a local cooperative with other families interested in guinea pig farming.

Shared Knowledge: Facilitate regular meetings for knowledge sharing, problem-solving, and collaborative decision-making among cooperative members.

Step 4: Expansion and Impact

Reproduction and Distribution: As the initial family's guinea pig population grows, they can provide nuclei to other families in the community, creating a ripple effect.

Monitoring and Support: Regular check-ins by project coordinators to monitor progress, provide ongoing support, and ensure sustainable practices are followed.

Step 5: Marketing and Sales

Community Branding: Develop a brand around the cooperative's guinea pig meat, emphasizing sustainability and local production.

Local Markets: Create avenues for selling the meat through local markets, restaurants, and direct-to-consumer channels.

Step 6: Evaluation and Feedback

Impact Assessment: Periodically evaluate the social, economic, and environmental impacts of the project.

Feedback Mechanism: Encourage feedback from participating families to continually refine and improve the model.
